This film is about Katniss and Peeta, two contestants from district twelve, who both enter the 74th Hunger Games; a competition that consists of two contestants from each district entering

a huge arena, which is controlled by the Capitol and a man named President Snow. They must survive natural dangers - and other

players, who may have already been trained in fighting

and survival- until they are the last one standing. At the end of the last film, both Peeta and Katniss left the Hunger Games alive. Though this is a relief for them and their families, it

starts causing problems within the districts.



Now, returning from their victory, they must both leave their families behind and go on the Victory Tour; but there is trouble yet to come, and President Snow is making preparations for the 75th, Hunger Games, the Quarter Quell, which takes place every 25 years, but the contestants are chosen from people who have already won before, including Katniss and Peeta, who are now surrounded by killers and trained fighters, in President Snow's attempt to destroy hope and rebellion in the districts.

#### Film Facts

95% of 22 critic's reviews were positive and it scored and average 7.6/10 with Rotten Tomatoes (a popular film review website that has existed for 15 years). This film has since then been nominated for the Golden Trailer Awards; the best action poster and best independent poster, and has won the Hollywood film award for best song, which was *Atlas* by Coldplay. The sequel, *Mockingjay* has been announced, and it will be split into two parts.

#### How many moons does the Earth have?

At least seven! Although the moon is the only one to obey a strict orbit of the Earth, another six asteroids do follow the earth around the sun. The first to be discovered was Cruithne, which has a strange oval shaped orbit. Since then, six others have been found. In fact, moons can come and go over billions of years. For example, Mars has two Moons, but not for long. Phobos, the larger moon, is spiraling inward and expected to crash into the planet within the next 10 million years. And so, in the future, Mars will only have a single Moon, called Deimos.





#### What is the world's largest city?

Honolulu, in Hawaii! Under a Hawaiian law established in 1907, the city, and county of Honolulu are the same. This means that Honolulu's area is 5509 square km, 72% of which is underwater, with a population of only of 876 thousand. The world's most populated city is actually Mumbai, with 12.8 million residents. The Hawaiian Islands also produce over a third of the world's pineapples. They were known as the

Sandwich Islands until they were renamed Hawaii in 1778.

#### What is the largest man-made structure in the world?

Fresh Kills landfill site, in New York! Opened in 1948,the 12 square km site is situated on the western shore of Staten Island is made up of four sections which contain over fifty years of household waste, and is taller than the statue of liberty. The dump was closed in 2001, only to be opened again to contain the enormous amount of debris created by the destruction of the World Trade Centre. Now, permanently closed, it is being landscaped into parks and a wildlife facility.





#### How long can a chicken live without a head?

Two years! In 1945, in Colorado, a chicken called Mike was beheaded...and lived. Miraculously the axe missed his jugular vein and left enough of his brain for him to survive. Mike became a national celebrity, earning \$4500 a month at sideshows, and was valued at \$10000. He was fed and watered using an eyedropper, and spent his time pecking for food with his neck. LOTS OF FUN!!!!





I like the idea of having primary, infants and secondary separated







## **Sports: Belgium and the 2014 World Cup**


## A possible candidate

Summer 2014 is around the corner and the footballing nations are getting prepared for what could be a chance at the title. The World Cup, definitely the best title a footballer can win in their entire career, is being held in Brazil where 32 teams will compete for glory. The clear favorites are Spain and Brazil; however chances are high that "smaller" teams will surprise one or two of the "bigger" teams. One of these is Belgium, who have clearly earned its place after leading their group with 26 points and qualifying easily.

Belgium's national team, also known as the "Red Devils", has been in existence since 1904 when it played its first match on May 1st against France drawing 3-3. Belgium has made twelve appearances already in the



World Cup with the best result being fourth place; its first appearance was in 1930. It is nowadays managed by Marc Wilmots and his assistant Vital Borkelmans, and captained by Manchester City's central back, Vincent Kompany. They are currently 5<sup>th</sup> in the FIFA Ranking with only Spain, Germany, Argentina and Colombia (another team which could surprise a few) ahead of them.



Therefore it is not a surprise that they topped Group A having only dropped points on two occasions.

Belgium has achieved astonishing figures with 8 wins, 2 draws and not a single loss during the qualifiers, even though they had to encounter tough rivals such as Serbia and Croatia. Furthermore it managed not to get a single players sent off during the 8 matches which for professional football is quite an achievement. In the 10 matches, Belgium has only conceded 4 goals and has scored 18, giving them a fantastic ratio of 1.8 goals per match, which once again, is quite an achievement.



However results are not a surprise when you have a look at their team. On paper, Belgium can call upon an armada of stars, all plying their trade in Europe's most prestigious championships such as the Barclays Premier League and Liga BBVA. A team consisting of senior figures such as Marouane Fellaini, Vincent Kompany, Kevin Mirallas and Axel Witsel; and emerging stars such as Eden Hazard, Romelu Lukaku, Kevin de Bruyne, Toby Alderweireld and Thibaut Courtois – supposedly one of the best goalkeepers in the world.





The Red Devils led by Marc Wilmots will play an important part in Brazil 2014. Even though I am quite confident that Spain will once again win the title, we do have to watch out for this strong team that will definitely ruin the competition for some. With a best result being 4th place in 1986 and taking into account their current squad, it is, in my eyes, not a surprise that next summer these players will give their best in order to at least reach the quarter-finals and possibly into the semi-finals in order to beat what so far is their best result in a World Cup.
