

-What surprised you the most about the May Fete? (1st year he attends)




What surprised me most about the summer fete was the number of children and parents who attended and the fantastic amount of money that we made.

Why Germany Will Win the

World Cup

When the present Germany coach, Joachim Löw, first reached the national team in 2008, he started to introduce young players, such as Özil, Neuer or Müller. Now, 8 years later, after one final and three semifinals, the chance for these players to shine and lift the trophy has arrived.

DEFENSE

This is one of the positions where the team has become strongest. In the past few years, the arrival of Matt Hummels has offered more possibilities for Löw, such as allowing Boateng to play in one of the sides or placing Lahm as midfielder. Although Schmelzer, who was going to play as left-back will not be available due to an injury, the "Mannschaft" has other good players, such as Durm or Howedes to cover this position. As to the goalkeeper, Neuer has become a warranty.


MIDFIELD

This is where Germany makes the difference. The national team has a large amount of high-level players: Khedira, Schweinsteiger, Lahm, Kroos, Özil, Götze... who can both create and destroy opportunities and which will be determinant.





Key Players





ATTACK

This is the weakest part of the squad but still reasonably strong. Although Löw is taking to Brazil one only striker, Klose, other players such as Müller or Götze can occupy this position. Klose has not had a good year playing for Lazio, but always does well in the national team. As to the wings, in spite of Marco Reus' unlucky injury, Podolski and Müller have both played well for their respective clubs.



The reason why Germany is one of the main candidates to winning the world cup is that they have many high-level players in almost all positions. Despite the team being generally young, they have adapted to play together with excellent outputs, as can be seen from their results in the qualification stage: with all victories except one draw against Sweden.
